STANDARD ON CONTINUING COMPETENCY IN EMERGENCY SKILLS

Every two years, midwives will participate in an emergency skills course that is approved by the College of Midwives of Manitoba.

Where a midwife is an instructor of an approved emergency skills program, they will be considered to have met the above requirement when they provide evidence of having taught at least one emergency skills course that includes all emergency skills in the previous 24 months.

The midwife will present evidence of having met the requirements upon annual renewal of registration.

Acceptable courses/assessments include:

- Canadian Association of Midwives Emergency Skills Course
- Midwives Association of Manitoba Emergency Skills Course
- Association of Ontario Midwives: Emergency Skills Workshop
- Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Canada: Advances in Labour and Risk Management (ALARM)
- A Canadian Midwifery Education Programs Emergency Skills course
- Society of Obstetricians and Gynecology of Canada: Managing Obstetrical Risk Efficiently (MORE OB) (with Emergency Skills Stations)
- Other courses accepted by the CMM as equivalent

Please note: Review of emergency skills is recommended every 6-12 months.
